Its varied climate supports about 65,000 animal species and it is the only country in the world with both lions and tigers. Its people are just as diverse; a huge range of languages are spoken and many different religions are practised. There is also a big divide between the rich and poor. Many rural areas suffer from high levels of poverty and in big cities poverty exists side by side with extreme wealth.

Young People

5.6% of children die before they reach their 5th birthday.



Education

Only **59%** of boys and **49%** of girls attend secondary school.



Women's Rights

47% of girls are married before their 18th birthday.



Land & Food

43% of the population are underweight.



Poverty

33% of people live in poverty.
